Holeman reported the chairman of the committee did say the Home Rule Constitutional Amendment will not be heard this year. Holeman said there is still a chance it could be considered further.

13. Downtown Manhattan update - Gina Scroggs (5 minutes)

Scroggs reported Downtown Manhattan Inc. is going to host the first ever Breast Cancer Run in Manhattan. Scroggs said it is April 22nd at 8:00 a.m. and the benefit will go to the Johnson Cancer Research Center. Scroggs stated they have been working closely with the local Masons. Scroggs said the Masons have arranged free cancer screenings for the Manhattan and Wamego area.

Scroggs said they are working on a comprehensive downtown study.

14. RCPD update - Captain Josh Kyle (3-5 minutes)

Kyle said "Part 1" crimes are the more severe crimes RCPD is required to report to the Federal Government.

Kyle said overall Part 1 crimes increased 4.1% in 2016 and 14% decrease in structural burglaries. Kyle reported motor vehicle thefts are down 5%. Kyle said there was a significant decrease in DUI

enforcement.

19. Marlatt/Denison Reconstruction Project

Hobson discussed the Marlatt/Denison Reconstruction Project. Hobson asked if the commission wants to proceed with the Marlatt/Denison Reconstruction Project as there has been some concern expressed in the past.

Waller reviewed the project.

Wells stated he is not going to hold the project up. Wells said he will stand by his word that Denison is bordered on both sides by KSU and feels they should participate in the project. Wells said he would rather spend the funds to continue improvements to Marlatt Avenue. Wells asked if the truck route traffic is going to be enforced.

Ott discussed the truck travel routes.

Wilson said he feels like it is a project that needs to be done with NBAF. Wilson stated he is not opposed to asking the University if they are willing to contribute as the project is largely for the University and NBAF. Wilson said it is doubtful given the State funding situation.

Rodriguez stated he agrees with both. Rodriguez said he is concerned with Denison and the truck traffic.

The Board agreed by consensus to move forward with the project as presented.
